- Role Distribution: Some of the senior leadership and specialist roles, which attract higher pay, are currently held by men.
- Full-Time vs Part-Time Patterns: A higher proportion of female employees work part-time, often in roles with lower hourly rates compared to full-time managerial positions.

#### Measures to Address the Gap

- Recruitment and Promotion: Review recruitment practices to encourage gender balance in senior and specialist roles, including targeted outreach and transparent promotion criteria.
- Annual Monitoring: Commit to annual gender pay gap reporting and analysis to track progress and identify further actions.
